"In memoriam"

The Rector introduces the service:

Dear friends we have gathered around this memorial today to remember before God all those from this community who were caught up in the tragic events of the two world wars and subsequent conflicts.

We remember those who were killed in action or by disease, the bereaved, the lost, the families that were shattered, the wounded, maimed and injured, those who held in silence unspeakable memories of warfare. As we remember those who fought and those who remained anxiously at home in this community, let us pray that God will heal all memories, speak a word of peace and bring us his healing. At this time we also remember before God those across the world who this day suffer because of war and conflict.

So let us commend to his safe keeping, those who have died for their country in war; those who we know about, and whose memory we honour; and all who have lived and died in the service of the peoples of the world.
