Jesus: Where is your faith?

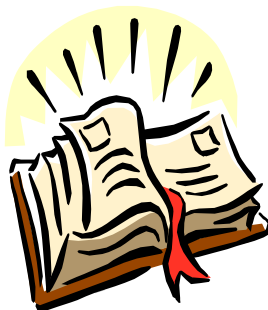

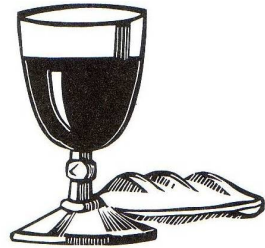
