Our ringers also have different levels of musical prowess and providing that they can tell their left hand from their right and be able to count to four, a high degree of success and enjoyment is achieved by all.

## **School Visiting.**

St Mary's Church is very proud to have a C of E (Aided) Primary School. There are strong and developing links between the church and school.

We support the school by being involved in regular school and class assemblies. On major festivals there will often be a Eucharist in school, held in the main hall. Individual classes also visit St Mary's Church during a week-day morning to enrich the connection between church and school. The annual year six leavers service is also held at the church.



# Pastoral Visiting.

During regular (non-pandemic) times the pastoral team make scheduled visits to the local care / nursing homes. These visits will either be for an act of worship or for pastoral support held in group form or one-to-one. Individual house visits are also undertaken as requested by parishioners.
